Course Objective

Adaptation seeks to moderate harm or exploit beneficial opportunities. Most of the research on adaptation to date has focused on public spending on adaptation rather than private adaptation, although it may be likely that most pension funds, insurance companies, asset and fund managers who want of the adaptation financing needs appear with the private actors affected by climate change. Understanding this will help to moderate and potentially accelerate adaptation, as well as address the role of government incentives for non-financial objectives. adaptation projects. 

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CLASSROOM TRAINING




